President's Message Sick Leave Coverage Update

The San Diego Chapter is currently handling two separate Sick Leave Coverage assignments. Both assignments, when combined, total approximately 190 pools and spas. This is a large undertaking that is incredibly important. In essence, each member that has been assigned a pool/spa to service has the responsibility to see to it that the account is maintained impeccably with each visit. The servicing member must make contact with the homeowner either in person or on the phone to introduce themselves and explain why they will be taking over the service temporarily. The servicing member should provide the homeowner with contact information and encourage the homeowner to call with any concern no matter how small or trivial the homeowner may think the issue to be. The servicing member should let the homeowner know that a response for such an issue or concern will be addressed within 24 hours, and not put off until next week's scheduled visit. Any problems with the pool that the servicing member encounters should be communicated to the sick member and the Sick Leave Chairmen immediately. Any repairs needed to be performed must have authorization from the sick member. It is recommended that every member read the San Diego Sick Leave Coverage Plan now so as to avoid a reprimand, fine, suspension, or expulsion.

Unfortunately, one homeowner has already canceled the service with the sick member and hired a new pool service due to the poor performance of the servicing member. This will not be tolerated by the Sick Leave Committee or the Chapter Board. Said servicing member is looking at severe penalties along with possible expulsion from IPSSA. Do not let a problem pool get worse. If a pool needs extra attention call the Sick Leave Chairmen and explain that help is needed,

reinforcements will be called in if necessary.

In addition to the two ongoing sick leave coverage assignments, two members have entered the hospital for unexpected treatments. Their status is uncertain at this time. Both members have made their own arrangements for service coverage up to this point. However, things could change and the Chapter may have to step in and provide service. A fifth member with over 100 accounts is suffering, and suffering is an understatement, with a herniated disc in his back. This member currently has help with his route and is taking medication along with intense physical therapy with the hope of avoiding the surgery that the doctors are recommending.

As President of this Chapter, I would like to say that I have faith in you, the members of this Chapter, that you will find the will and the strength to rise to the challenges we are facing as a group and perform at a high level. Take the time to put in the extra effort.

SPEC Underground Economy Bill Goes to the Governor September 1, 2010

AB 2770 (Assemblymembers Monning and Berryhill), a bi-partisan bill supported by SPEC to provide additional tools for regulators to ferret out and prosecute those contractors in the cash economy, passed both houses of the California Legislature and is now on the Governor's desk for signature.

AB 2770 requires the Employment Development Department, in consultation with the Franchise Tax Board, the Economic and Department of Justice, Department of Insurance, Labor and Workforce Development Agency and industry representatives, to develop and implement a set of standards that, if met by an employer, would trigger a recommendation for a tax audit or investigation of an employer for violating state laws regarding wages, hours, and working conditions.

As originally proposed, AB 2770 would apply to all employers. However, due to concerns regarding the costs of implementing the bill, AB 2770 was recently amended to create a pilot program to identify non-compliant contractors in the swimming pool and spa industry. These amendments aim to reduce the cost of implementing the bill as well as focus this new program on an industry plagued by contractors in the cash economy.

"AB 2770 is designed to use technology rather than boots on the ground to identify and prosecute contractors who cheat will focus on the swimming pool and spa industry," stated John Norwood, President of SPEC. "The problem with the current system is that the Contractors' State License Board has to catch a contractor who cheats in the act. They have to implement labor intensive sting operations or have investigators run down a contractor on a job site in order to ensure successful prosecution. With limited resources and state employee furloughs, these labor intensive activities are a challenge," continued Norwood.

A provision in AB 2770 would require state regulators to examine those contractors who take workers' compensation exemptions and look at items such as material to labor ratios to determine if contractors are cheating on their reported payroll, workers' compensation insurance or paying employees or contractors cash to avoid paying taxes.

Now that AB 2770 has passed both the Senate and the Assembly, we must await the Governor's decision to sign or veto the bill. "So, we are still not out of the woods," said Norwood. The Department of Finance estimates the cost of implementing this bill is \$1.3 million. This is a small amount in comparison with the billions of dollars the state is losing due to the failure of non-compliant contractors to pay payroll and income taxes. But, the magnitude of the state deficit places any new program in jeopardy.

Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger has until the end of September to sign, veto or just let AB 2770 become law, without his signature. SPEC will be working hard to convince the Governor to sign this important bill into law.
