**Subject:** Plastering Issues in Hot and Dry Weather

This is written for builders, remodelers, and pool plastering contractors who are interested in providing a long-lasting and pleasingly aesthetic pool plaster finish, especially colored plaster.

Recent studies by onBalance have determined that plastering in hot and dry weather can have a detrimental effect to the quality and durability of the plaster surface. At issue is the fact that when a plaster surface dries out, hydration and hardening stops. This results in a plaster surface that is soft and weak and that will not be ready to withstand being submerged in water.

To demonstrate this issue, a plaster coupon (A) was formed that was then exposed to the sun all day, with temperatures reaching 90 degrees at about 30% humidity. The next morning, this coupon was placed in balanced water (actually +0.3 SI). After five days, plaster dust was visible on the bottom of the tank. The coupon was removed and the plaster dust (calcium carbonate) that developed in the water was dissolved by adding acid. The resulting calcium hardness level in the tank was determined to have increased 65 ppm.

Next, the experiment was repeated (Coupon B) when the ambient air temperature was hotter at about 100 degrees, and humidity was lower at about 20%. An additional coupon (C) was formed also, but this coupon was immediately placed in a controlled environment for 24 hours to harden, where the temperature was 75 degrees at about 35% humidity.

The next morning both coupons (B and C) were placed in separate water tanks. After five days, the water in the tank with plaster coupon B, which was exposed to the hot sun, had a calcium hardness increase of more than 120 ppm, after the plaster dust was dissolved. That is the equivalent of about 20 pounds of solid calcium carbonate being dissolved from the plaster surface of a 20,000 gallon pool.

Plaster coupon C, that hardened in the temperature- and humidity-controlled environment did not develop any visible plaster dust. The calcium hardness of the water increased a nominal 10 ppm.

In these tests, it was also determined that if calcium chloride (a hardening accelerator) is added to the plaster mix, an even higher amount of plaster dust formed in comparison to plaster samples that did not have any calcium chloride added, regardless of temperature.

When calcium is lost from a plaster surface, it causes a loss in density and an increase in the porosity of the surface. This in turn will result in a loss of durability of the plaster surface and will likely trap dirt and minerals easier, causing discoloration sooner than would otherwise occur.

Contractors should be aware that with dark colored pool plaster, an increase in the

porosity will cause whitening or a lighter color developing over time as the surface loses calcium or other plaster material. This has been a sore issue for the pool industry for a long time. Other improper plastering practices also contribute to this problem besides plastering in hot dry weather. Adding calcium chloride to an integrally colored plaster mix, or applying excessive water while troweling can also result in increased porosity and lightening. Improper water chemistry is often incorrectly blamed for the whitening of colored plaster, including pebble and quartz pool finishes. Of course, whitening due to scale depositing on the surface is a water chemistry issue.

Some plastering people claim that the solution to plastering in hot and dry weather is to immediately fill the pool with water after final troweling; that it is better if plaster is cured under water, which helps prevent the plaster from cracking in the heat.

That is only partially true. Yes, the pool plaster matrix does gain added strength while curing under water, but the plaster "surface" needs to be sufficiently hardened before being submerged in water. Otherwise, the water filling the pool overwhelms the correct ratio of water to cement at the surface, which can cause a number of defects, including a general dissolution of plaster material from the surface. This has been documented. (See my prior blog post "Poor Plastering Practices vs. Aggressive Water") Only after the surface has been properly hardened is curing under water beneficial.

In regards to cracking, good plasterers know that using a low water: cement ratio, little or no calcium chloride, and no excessive water troweling is very effective in avoiding cracking, even in hot weather.

Finally, the best solution to plastering in hot and dry weather while avoiding the detrimental effects it causes is to "tent" a pool and use an evaporative cooler to supply cool and humid air underneath the tent. This will also protect pool finishers. Tenting should be used during the entire plastering process, the six hour waiting period before filling, and until the pool is full of water.

The Portland Cement Association (PCA) and American Concrete Institute (ACI) have conducted studies showing that cement work in hot and dry temperatures has a detrimental effect to the quality and durability of such products. They also suggest various methods to protect concrete surfaces from hot and dry temperatures. Pool plastering is a more, not a less challenging process than other cementitious applications due to the fact that pool plaster is generally troweled to a smoother finish than is concrete flatwork, as well as the thinner application, the rich mix and the need to be maintainable in the pool water and chemistry environment. Thus it is even more critical for pool finishers to follow optimal practices derived from cement science.

## WATER SAFETY TIPS YOU CAN USE

With the start of the swimming season upon us, along with warmer temperatures and all of the challenges of maintaining our pools, come **responsibilities** and **opportunities**.

As pool professionals, we have the responsibility to ensure that our customer's pools are safe for their kids and everyone using their pool. Since we are usually at their pool every week, we notice things that the homeowner or property manager may not. This gives us the opportunity to bring issues to their attention that will make their pool safer. This also may present the opportunity to make some additional income for ourselves, or one of our Chapter Supporters for referring work to them, to correct a safety-related issue at one of your pools.

Throughout the summer, the Water Safety Committee will be sharing water safety tips with you; simple things you can do to help make your customer's pools safer while at the same time reminding them that your concern for the safety of the people using their pool, makes you a valuable partner in the operation of their home. Let's do our part to keep pools in San Diego safe this summer !

### TIP OF THE MONTH:

#### **Share water safety and drowning prevention information with your customers.**

There is a wealth of information available from many sources. You can start by providing your customers with a water safety brochure and Water Watcher tag. 50 of each of these items are free and available from the IPSSA home office. There is room on the back of the IPSSA brochure to attach your business card or print your company info. More information is available at **www.waterwatcher.org**. The Consumer Products Safety Commission (CPSC) has developed the **Pool Safely** campaign. A wide range of free materials, including brochures, door hangers, and window decals are available through their website **www.poolsafely.gov**.

Several of their items are also available in English and Spanish. You can drop this information in your customer's mailbox, or in most cases, you can include them with your billing statement without additional postage.

Since most invoices and statements allow you to include additional information, you may want to include water safety notes to share information and/or applicable websites with your customer.

Whatever you choose to do, your customers will appreciate your concern for the well-being of their families and friends.

## Officials make plea for pool safety

### CHULA VISTA –

It's called "Pool Safely" - a nationwide program aimed at educating adults on what they can do to protect children from swimming pool dangers.

The program's advocates, including Olympic swimming gold medalist Janet Evans, came to Chula Vista Thursday on the eve of Memorial Day weekend to promote the campaign at the Parkway Family Aquatic Center. The initiative by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission is in its second year.

Commission Chairman Inez Tenenbaum said at a news conference that parents need to be more wary about their children around pools during the summer months, when elevated pool use causes the frequency of water-related injuries and fatalities to rise.

So far this year, 118 child drownings and near drownings have occurred nationwide, the commission said, and that's before the start of what officials call the summer "trauma season."

In San Diego County, drowning was the leading cause of death from 2000 to 2007 for children ages 1 to 4, according to a 2009 report on unintentional injuries by Safe Kids San Diego and Rady Children's Hospital.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission has found a similar trend nationwide, with around 76 percent of reported drowning fatalities involving children younger than age 5.

Evans, who lives in Orange County, said parents can't relax when their children are around swimming pools.

"When kids are at play and occupied, it is like downtime for parents," she said. "You just can't do that."

Tenenbaum, Evans and Chula Vista Mayor Cheryl Cox all drove home the need for pool-side precautions - from fences that encircle home swimming pools to alarms for doors that open onto backyard pools.

The chief advice given was to be vigilant when children are playing around water, even at public pools that have a lifeguard on duty.

"Simple steps save lives," said Yosina Lissebeck, president of Safe Kids San Diego and a parent whose daughter nearly drowned in a plastic children's pool when she was 14 months old. "Let's do all we can to put these barriers and protections in place."

- Never leave a child unattended near a pool.
- Teach your child how to swim.
- Keep children away from pool drains and exposed pipes.
- Search the pool and spa first if a child goes missing.
- Learn to perform CPR.
- For emergencies, have a phone at the pool or spa.

### CA Building Standards Commission Issues 45-Day Notice of New Commercial Pool Standards-SPEC Responds

On May 13<sup>th</sup> the California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) issued a 45-day notice to take public comments on a proposal sponsored on behalf of the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to enact new building standards for commercial swimming pools and water parks. The public comment period will end at 5:00 p.m. on June 27<sup>th</sup>. In addition, any interested person may request a public hearing on the proposed new building standards so long as such a request is submitted in writing to the CBSC no later than 15 days from the close of the public comment period which would be Friday, June 10<sup>th</sup>.

The 133-page proposal by the Department of Public Health was first unveiled before the Ad Hoc Advisory Committee to the CBSC on March 24<sup>th</sup>. At that hearing, John Norwood, President of the Spa and Pool Industry Education Council (SPEC) testified that the Department of Public Health had failed to solicit input with regard to the proposed new building standards from the industry. In response from questions from the Chairman of the advisory committee as to whether the department had consulted with local building officials and the swimming pool and water park industry, representatives of the department admitted they had not. The department indicated that the new building standards had been under

development for the last 8 to 10 years. The Ad Hoc Advisory took the proposed building standards under submission and recommended that the Department of Public Health hold meeting with the industry before the proposed new standards were heard before the full California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) scheduled for October of this year.

Following up on the advisory commission hearing, SPEC and the Department of Public Health agreed to set up meetings to review the new standards. SPEC formed a working group consisting of 14 of the leading commercial swimming pool and design professionals in California. "A first draft of the combined comments from this group has recently been completed and we are trying to finalize this document so as to have the most time effective meetings with the CDPH" said John Norwood of SPEC. "We have also recently sent the these new building standards to representatives of key pool manufacturers for their input" continued Norwood.

According to Norwood, SPEC is currently awaiting proposed meeting dates from the Department of Public Health. "Just to be certain that we will make progress with the department, SPEC has already sent an e-mail notification to the representative of the California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) to put them on notice that we (SPEC) intend to request a public hearing on the proposed new building standards" indicated Norwood.

In the public notice document, the policy statement issued by the Department of Public Health to support the proposed building standards indicates that the new public swimming pool regulations, including standards for water park facilities such as spray grounds, are necessary as the public risk associated with spray grounds is significant and has been associated with several illness outbreaks around the country. The purpose of the proposed new standards is to update existing public pool regulations to reflect current health and safety practices, industry standards and public pool operations. The proposal incorporates, by reference, the NSF International Standard/American National Standards Institute 50-2010 effective August 2010, and the United States Diving, Inc. Diving Rulebook effective January 1, 2010. The document indicates that the new standards will add \$4,687 to new pool construction costs or renovation costs.
