SPEC Prevails At Building Standards Hearing

The California Building Standards Commission met on October 19th to consider a revision of the building standards for public pools and water parks proposed by the California Department of Public Health. John Norwood, President of SPEC, presented testimony to the Commission based on the work of a SPEC sub-committee consisting of leading commercial pool builders and design professionals that have been working on the Department's proposed new regulation since March of this year.

The pool regulations, officially known as Title 24, were the only controversial item of the Commission's lengthy agenda. Glenn Takeoka, Chief of the Environmental Management Branch, represented the California Department of Health requesting the Commission approve the new building standards for inclusion in the January 2012 code upgrade, effective July 1st, 2012. Mr. Takeoka testified that the building standards for commercial pools and other water facilities had not been changed since 1986. He made the point that water parks, spray grounds, water cannons and other like facilities were not even contemplated under the existing

regulations. He presented the Commissioners with a list of injuries and illnesses in California and other states that underscored the need to update the code. Finally, Mr. Takeoka testified that the Department Of Public Health had been working on this code upgrade for almost ten years. He also reported that the Department had spent considerable time over the last few months responding to concerns raised by SPEC and that his staff had taken many of the recommendations offered by the SPEC sub-committee.

The building standard proposal is supported by local county health officials from Nevada, Santa Barbara, Napa, Plumas and Ventura Counties. SPEC was the only organization to appear before the Commission in opposition to approval this year. John Norwood, SPEC President, began his presentation by making it clear that SPEC supported a revision of the commercial pool standards in order to modernize the code and to promote public safety. However, the SPEC recommendation was not to approve the revision for the 2012 code changes. Instead, SPEC requested that the proposed new building standards be returned for additional work. The additional work would include the proposal being subject to an process where the Commission appoints an advisory committee to mediate a discussion with all the stakeholders. Once that work was complete, the revision could be included in the 2013 triennial code upgrade, which becomes effective in 2014.

Norwood testified that this would be the preferable process because it would make the revision a truly comprehensive document. He indicated that as hard as the SPEC sub-committee tried, there just was not sufficient time over the last few months to address all the issues raised by the experts brought in by SPEC. The

concern was that if the new regulations were approved for 2012, it would result in a piecemeal effort and other issues raised by SPEC might languish without resolution for years.

Norwood indicated that SPEC was very pleased by the number of its recommendations that were accepted by the Department of Public Health and looked forward to continuing the process. However, Norwood testified that there wasn't the time necessary for SPEC committee to meet on a number of issues with the technical committee for the Department of Public Health. He indicated that the additional time requested by SPEC would improve the final product. SPEC's position was supported by a letter from the California Building Code officials. In addition, Bob Raymer, Chairman of the Commission's Ad Hoc Advisory Committee and a staff engineer for the California Building Industry Association tested regarding his concern that operators of public pools and water parks and local building code officials were not included in the development of the new building standards.

In the end, the Commission voted to delay approval until at least their January meeting. They encouraged the Department of Public Health to organize a stakeholder meeting and to try to resolve outstanding issues. The commission indicated if a compromise could be reached that it would set the standards for possible review and approval at the January meeting. However, several Commission members expressed concern that more time was needed and that the standards should go over to the 2013 triennial code upgrade.

John Norwood commented that, "SPEC is pleased with the result of today's hearing. SPEC wants to work as a full partner with the Department to come up with a comprehensive revision of the code and this additional time will encourage a better process."
