President's Message

Spring is in full swing and swim season will be here before you know it. Here are a few things to keep in mind as the weather begins to warm up.

1) May is drowning Prevention Month. Do all you can to promote water safety with your clients. Order a batch of Water Watcher tags and brochures from IPSSA Management and distribute them to your customers. Make sure all the gates securing your pools are in working order. If not, advise the homeowner/property manager to make the needed repairs. Do this on the record (ex. on your computer generated invoice).

2) Update your yellow cards. If, heaven forbid, you were to go down and out, are your records accurate? The information you have on these cards is all the Sick Leave Committee has to organize and protect your business. You may have these details in your brilliant mind but who else knows the secret gate combo, the Dobermans' pet name or the day the customer pulls the cover for service. These details will assure your pools will be well cared for.

3) Train your customers to maintain their own water levels. Not only will this make your job a lot easier but it will protect you and all of IPSSA. The number one cause for insurance liability claims last year was Water damage from pools over flowing. More claims = **Higher Premium\$**

4) Continue to support SPEC. Our reps in Sacto were successful in getting our industry removed from bill AB2540. A second measure, AB1963 that would impose a blanket 4% tax on all services is due to be heard this week. Keep those letters to our legislators coming. The time to speak up is now.

SPEC PREVAILS ON POOL TAX MEASURE

"Pool Maintenance" Taken Out SPEC is pleased to announce a key victory on one of the service tax proposals!!

As introduced, AB 2540 by Assemblymember Gatto, listed "pool maintenance" as one of the target list of 27 services where state sales tax would be imposed. To comply with the bill, pool service professionals would have been required to add sales tax to their monthly invoices for pool services.

SPEC took an immediate and active oppose position on this dangerous measure. SPEC lobbyists John Norwood and Erin Norwood met with the author of this bill to explain how this bill would adversely affect the pool service industry. In addition, they lobbied literally every member of the Assembly Revenue & Taxation Committee in opposition to this bill. SPEC members were urged to submit grassroots letters to the author and the Assembly Revenue & Taxation Committee as well. AB 2540 was initially set to be heard on April 9th but was subsequently rescheduled for April 16th, and is now set for April 23rd.

After weeks of lobbying, SPEC advocates ultimately convinced the illness and injuries as well as minimizing unscheduled closures and costly repairs of these public pools. Other supporters of this bill included the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the National Swimming Pool Foundation (NSPF), National Environmental Health Association (NEHA), Foundation for Pool and Spa Industry Education (FPSIE), Independent Pool and Spa Service Association (IPSSA), state and local health departments, industry, academia, and pool operators.

"We are pleased with this modest start," commented John Norwood President of SPEC, "but more work is needed to ensure passage through the legislature. Despite being the State with the largest number of public pools, California has yet to adopt the provisions of the Model Aquatic Health Code that establishes a standardized public pool operator training program. This bill is a good start down that path." AB 1726 will proceed to the Assembly Appropriations Committee for its next hearing sometime in May.

SPEC SUPPORTED BILL ADVANCES *Limiting the Underground Economy*

AB 1794 by Assemblyman Das Williams (D-Santa Barbara) was heard in the Assembly Committee on Business, Professions, and Consumer Protection last week. This bill extends current law that requires workers' compensation

insurers to perform an annual payroll audit on roofing contractors to all contractors. This bill does not require an on-site visit as part of the annual audit requirement so insurers can perform this function electronically. In addition, AB 1794 requires contractors to report hiring of new employees to their workers' comp carrier within 20 days of a new hire. This is the same amount of time to report a new hire to the Employment Development Department for tax purposes.

AB 1794 seeks to address the problem of to unscrupulous contractors who intentionally underreport or fail to report employees as a means to curtail paying adequate workers' compensation premiums. The problem of premium insurance fraud has led to workers' compensation premium rates skyrocketing throughout the state, and has forced many law-abiding construction employers to pay two to three times more in workers' compensation premiums to cover "high risk" workers.

The bill is supported by labor organizations across the state as well CSLB. "AB 1794 will help deter workers' compensation fraud and limit the underground economy," declared John Norwood, President of California Spa and Pool Industry Education Council (SPEC), "This bill requires all contractors to follow the same rules and incur the same expenses when bidding on a project, thus creating a more competitive bid environment. By making contractors report new employees, AB 1794 will help capture a portion of the billions of dollars lost in underreported payroll taxes, at a time when California needs it most."

The bill passed both the Assembly Insurance and Business and Professions Committees and will be heard in the Assembly Appropriations Committee sometime within the next few weeks.

SPEC SUPPORTED BILL ADVANCES

Pool Operator Certification and Training AB 1726, sponsored by National Pool Safety Foundation, was heard in the Assembly Health Committee last week. This bill seeks to establish the Public Pool Health and Safety Act of 2012 which requires an owner of a public swimming pool to contract with or employ a qualified pool operator for pool maintenance. More specifically AB 1726 would require a pool operator training course to be registered with and approved by the local enforcing agency and sets forth requirements for the training course, including 14 hours of training relative to a specific list of pool maintenance subjects.

As introduced, AB 1726 applied to all public pools. However, the bill was opposed by a number of apartment and condominium associations, bed and breakfast operators, hotels, resorts, and

camp ground facilities. In order to minimize the opposition, proponents of the bill reduced the scope of the measure to pools operated by lodging facilities such as hotels, motels, campgrounds and resorts, as well as public pools such as those operated by the YMCA and other similarly situated organizations.

SPEC recognizes the value in well trained public pool operators and supports this bill. SPEC lobbyist John Norwood appeared before the Assembly Health Committee and encouraged the members to support this much needed legislation as the most cost effective way to reduce

SPEC PREVAILS ON SERVICE TAX MEASURE

Service Tax Bill Amended

As of the last SPEC Alert, we had one service tax bill down and one to go. Now we are pleased to announce we have defeated the other service tax bill!

As introduced, AB 1963 (Huber – D) would have imposed a blanket 4% tax on all services, except for medical, educational, auto repair, tax preparation, legal and agricultural services.

As previously reported, AB 2540 was amended to take "pool maintenance" out of the list of proposed services to be taxed. AB 1963 would still have imposed the blanket 4% tax and was pending a hearing in the Assembly Revenue & Taxation Committee. Now both bills are amended and are no longer tax bills.

SPEC had taken immediate and active opposition on this oppressive measure. SPEC lobbyists John Norwood and Erin Norwood met with the author of this bill and explained how this bill would adversely affect the pool service industry. In addition, they lobbied literally every member of the Assembly Revenue & Taxation Committee in opposition to this bill. SPEC members were urged to submit grassroots letters to the author and the Assembly Revenue & Taxation Committee as well.

After weeks of SPEC lobbying, the author of the bill decided to give up on a service tax bill for 2012. Instead, the bill is as amended to require a study on the service tax issue. With these amendments, SPEC removed its opposition.

"We are very pleased about the triumphs for the pool industry over increased taxes," stated John Norwood, President of SPEC. "We would like to thank those of you who made a difference by writing or communicating with your elected representatives in the State Assembly. Grassroots support has made an obvious result and kept the pool industry free from extended burdensome taxes."
