President’s Message

IPSSA is the best association in providing pool service professionals top notch liability insurance, life insurance, sick leave coverage, educational opportunities and much more.

The San Diego Chapter of IPSSA is one of the best and has been one of the best chapters in the entire Association. IPSSA and our Chapter as a part of this association has to adapt and change if it wants to continue to be the best in providing pool service professionals what they need and want.

At the peak of our Chapter membership in 2006 we had a total of 145 members. At the end of 2007 we had 140 members - 114 regular members and 26

employee members. From 2007 to today we now have 86 regular members and 20 employee members, which represents roughly a 27% decline from our peak in 2006.

When we break down the demographics of our membership it is noted that the age of our membership ranges from 28 years of age to 86 years of age. The average age in our Chapter is 56 years old, of which 43% of our members are over the age of 60 and 80% are over the age of 50 years old!

IPSSA has recently given our Chapter an opportunity to change and adapt to overcome the age and decline in our membership. It is called “Fast Track”. At our May general meeting we will be taking

a vote to implement this provision for membership in our Chapter Standing Rules. The New Membership committee, the San Diego Chapter Board, and I as your President see this as an opportunity and are asking for your support in implementing the “Fast Track” to our Standing Rules. We will have one last open discussion for any comments or concerns prior to the vote and encourage and look forward to seeing you at the meeting.

ARTICLE III NEW MEMBERSHIP APPLICANTS

Section 1 MEMBERSHIP FEE AND DEPOSIT

1.1 Must Pay Fees With Application

The new membership fee must accompany all new applications for membership. Applications without the fee will not be processed. \$50 of this fee is non-refundable if an applicant decides not to join.

1.2 Composition of Membership Fee

The new member application fee, to be determined by the Board, includes the Initiation Fee, CSPA Donation and Study Materials

1.3 IPSSA Dues

Another fee covering 2 months IPSSA dues will be collected with each new application. This check will be held until the applicant is voted in and will be sent to the Financial Office at that time.

Section 2 APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

2.1 Documents Required With Application

New applicants must present the following information and materials in order to be considered for membership: 1. Completed Application Form. 2. Copy of a valid Business License. 3. Some proof of 1 year work history in pool industry (1099 or W2). 4. A Fully and Legibly Completed Blue Card. 5. Completed Life Insurance Beneficiary form. 6. Checks for New Member Fees payable to San Diego IPSSA. 7. Check to IPSSA Management Company for two months Dues and Insurance and New Member Packet.

2.2 Prospective Member Attendance Requirements

The applicant must attend three of the next four consecutive meetings BEFORE being acted upon by the Board. If “Fast Tracked”, (Section 2.3) attendance requirement before approval is not required.

2.3 “Fast Track”

Prospective new members can be Fast Tracked into membership by completing one of the following conditions: 1) Hold a current Certified Pool Operator certificate: 2) Shall have taken and completed the Association of Pool and Spa Professionals (APSP Tech 1 or Tech 2 Certification). Once the new member has been accepted as an IPSSA member they must take the IPSSA Water Chemistry Exam within 12 months of acceptance.

2.34 Prospective Member Packet

A prospective member packet will be given to applicants upon receipt of fees.

Section 3 ENTRANCE EXAM AND INTERVIEW

3.1 Required All new applicants and transferees are required to take and pass the IPSSA Water Chemistry test, the supplemental Chapter test and formal interview. Approximately 70% (20 of 30) of the questions on the Chapter test must be correctly answered to pass. Should the applicant fail the test, a 30 day period (or less if agreeable by the Board) must lapse prior to reexamination.

Section 4 NEW MEMBER CHAIRMAN

The Vice President is responsible for the processing of new members. However, he may delegate this responsibility to a New Member Chairman, who would be appointed to serve as the coordinator for processing all prospective new members.

While service techs go about their business taking care of various swimming pools, and specifically after they lower pH by adding acid, they may ask themselves why the pH of the water begins to rise back up again afterwards. Also, they may wonder why this pH rise happens faster and higher in some pools than in others.

The primary answer lies in the behavior of carbon dioxide in the water. Carbon dioxide (also known as CO₂) is formed when acid is added to pool water, and it is this compound that can affect changes in pH.

Carbon dioxide (CO₂) is a common, essential compound in nature. It is found almost everywhere, from what flowers and trees breathe in, to what humans and animals breathe out; and to the bubbles in the soda you drink. In its warmer phase it is a gas, and in its colder phase it becomes a solid – dry ice. Our atmosphere (the air we breathe) contains a relatively small amount of gaseous carbon dioxide – only about 0.03% to 0.06% – which is fortunate, since levels around 10% or higher would cause us all to lose consciousness! Because it exists in the air, a slight amount of carbon dioxide can be absorbed by water.

When dissolved in water, CO₂ primarily exists as aqueous CO₂, but a very small amount also combines with water to form carbonic acid: $\text{CO}_2 + \text{H}_2\text{O} = \text{H}_2\text{CO}_3$, and the slightly acidic nature of this compound lowers the pH.

The more CO₂ in the water, the lower the pH. The less CO₂, the higher the pH. Pool water with no dissolved CO₂ (and alkalinity of 80 ppm) will have a pH of about 8.4.

As we all know, when acid is added, both the alkalinity and the pH are lowered. The *alkalinity* is lowered because the added acid reacts with bicarbonate and carbonate alkalinity in the water, converting it to CO₂ and carbonic acid – which is then no longer alkalinity.

After adding acid to pool water, the *pH* goes down (at first) because of the effect on pH of the increasing amount of CO_{2(aq)} produced by adding the acid. Afterwards, the pH begins to rebound and eventually can return to its original level. This is due to the equilibrium relationship between the amount of CO₂ in the water and the amount of CO₂ in the air above the water. This is known as Henry's Law.

Since the acid addition forms more CO_{2(aq)} in the water than is dictated by the equilibrium, most of the CO_{2(aq)} created by the addition of acid will then begin to release and off-gas into the atmosphere – which will gradually raise the pH level *but not the alkalinity*. The alkalinity remains the same.

The “natural” level of CO₂ in balanced pool water after it has had sufficient time to reach equilibrium with the atmosphere is from about 0.5 ppm to 2.0 ppm and the pH will be around 8.0 to 8.5 depending on the amount of carbonate alkalinity.

Since CO₂ in water helps keep calcium soluble in water, pool water should be maintained with just enough CO₂ to keep the pH down in the mid to high 7 range. Too much CO₂ in water creates low pH conditions that are aggressive to pool plaster, and no CO₂ may create high pH conditions that can be scale forming to all pool surfaces. Of course, etching and scaling are something service techs are always trying to prevent from happening.
